# What is a Community Foundation?

Community foundations are public charities dedicated to improving the lives of people in a local area (Jackson County!). Their principal function is serving donors and their community by building permanent endowed funds for philanthropic purposes. Most contributions to a community foundation are permanently endowed, meaning they are permanently invested to produce income. The income earned is then used to help meet the community's charitable needs. Gifts to a community foundation continue to benefit your community forever! They are unique from other charities as they don't usually conduct programs, but rather support new or existing programs of other non-profit organizations through grantmaking. Community foundations also play a key role in identifying and solving community problems and they serve as a neutral convener, bringing diverse opinions and players together for the good of the whole community. Donors like you may set up an individual fund and have essentially as little or as much control as you wish.

## Our History Matters

The Jackson Community Foundation was founded in 1948 with two very special gifts. During World War II, the families of Lt. John L. Carter and Pfc. John Gilbert Wickwire donated proceeds from life insurance policies that were purchased in the name of their sons, both of whom lost their lives in battle. The Jackson War Chest accepted the insurance contribution, plus additional gifts added by each family. When discussion of starting a community foundation began, a total of \$20,000 was transferred to begin a permanent endowment for Jackson County.

# The Youth Advisory Committee (YAC)



JCF's Youth Advisory Committee (YAC) mission statement: We are a diverse group of students uniting our voices and using our time and resources to better the lives of youth in Jackson County!

YAC was established in 1989 through a Challenge Grant from the W.K. Kellogg Foundation. Since then YAC has given over \$1.5 million dollars to projects that impact the youth of Jackson County!

YAC members volunteer their time and talents to better their community while developing leadership skills and philanthropic experience. In 2014, the Board of Trustees approved the appointment of two YAC members as voting members on our Board, each serving a two-year term beginning their junior year of high school.

Based on the results of a 2017 Youth Needs Assessment survey conducted by YAC, they developed and held their first ever Youth Mental Health Grant Round in 2018.

## Our Youth Matter

YAC awarded a grant to the Highfields "Color Me Resilient" Program. This was a week-long art camp for Jackson County middle and high school students to learn about mental health issues and coping strategies. The camp culminated in a student-designed mural that was painted with community members as a part of Bright Walls.

## Southside Mural for Southside Pride

The Jackson Citizens Advisory Council spearheaded the initiative to create a mural on the Southside of Jackson honoring its history and to bring pride back to the Southside. The project was granted a total of \$4,000 dollars between 2018 and 2019. The 32" x 64" mural was created by four local artists: Devon Camel, Louise Cubille, Kimberly Swartz and Yhosef Ware. The mural was permanently placed on the outside of a building at 1336 Francis St. facing the MLK/Equity Trail for the entire community to enjoy.

The Jackson Community Foundation's Board of Trustees recognizes the importance of Diversity and Inclusion in a healthy community. In 2019, the Board and staff focused on this issue through their strategic planning and committee work. The following Equity Manifesto by Policy Link was adopted by the Board in August 2019. ## 2019 Carter Wickwire Philanthropy Award Recipients *Georgia and Travis Fojtasek*



Our 2019 Carter Wickwire Philanthropy Award recipients, Georgia and Travis Fojtasek, were honored at our Annual Fall Gala in September. The award honors a living individual or couple for service as both volunteer/trustee and donor to help grow community philanthropy in Jackson. Named after Lt. John L. Carter and Pfc. John Gilbert Wickwire, two men who lost their lives during battle in WWII and whose families subsequently donated their life insurance proceeds to help establish the Foundation in 1948.

Georgia and Travis have supported the Foundation financially and with their past service as Trustees. They established the Edward and Nella Fullman Memorial Scholarship in memory of Georgia's mother and father. Georgia is a member of the Carter Wickwire society, a society of individuals who have included the Jackson Community Foundation in their estate plan. During her 30 year tenure at Henry Ford Allegiance Health, Georgia worked tirelessly to help create the Center for Family Health, to bring a quality cardiac unit and more effective and comfortable cancer treatment center to Jackson. Travis has devoted much of his volunteerism to environmental causes and the arts. In 2012, Travis received the Jackson Citizen Patriot's Distinguished Citizen of the Year Award for his commitment in helping our community through a variety of efforts including Recycling Jackson and the Green Market.

Furthermore, the Foundation forwards its nominee(s) on to the Council of Michigan Foundations (CMF) for consideration of its Community Philanthropy Award. We are pleased to announce the Fojtaseks were awarded CMF's Community Philanthropy Award at their annual CMF Conference in Traverse City.

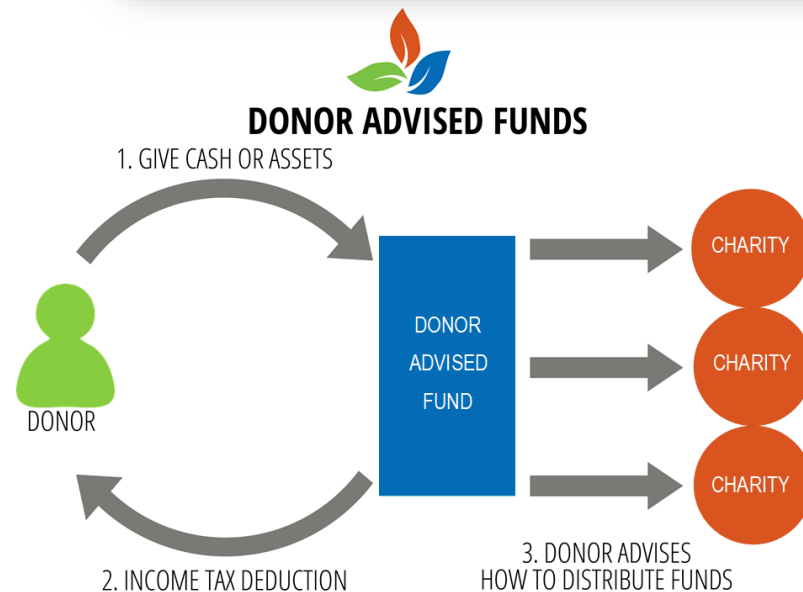

## Donor Advised Funds... you choose how we help our community!

In 2018, Donor Advised funds granted \$103,000 to our community. One of those grants was from the Samuel Higby and Margaret H. Camp Fund. They awarded \$7,500 to the Center for Family Health for Mobile Dental Equipment. The Center served 1,417 adults and children through the mobile dental program in 2017 with the majority of those served being children. While there is significant need to serve adults, particularly elderly adults, the Center had lacked a mobile dental chair to serve adults who may not be able to access dental services at their dental building. The grant was used to purchase a dental chair and related equipment so that they can extend services to Jackson County adults, especially seniors, through their mobile dental program.
