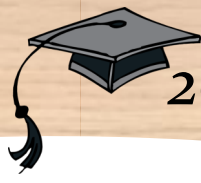
Our sponsors help defray the administrative costs of the Foundation. In doing so, that allows for more dollars to be earmarked for programming in Jackson County.

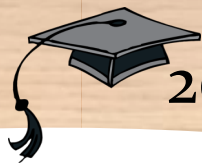

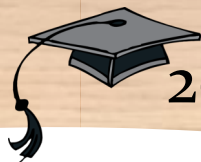

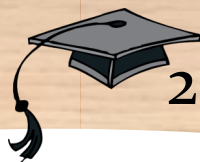
Dennis J. Beck Memorial Scholarship Up to \$1,000
